BYLAW NO. 4-2021

A BYLAW TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE OF LOREBURN TO BORROW \$60,000 (SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS) FROM PRAIRIE CENTRE CREDIT UNION REPAYABLE OVER THREE YEARS TO RENOVATE THE PREMISES AT 534 MAIN STREET, LOREBURN SASKATCHEWAN.

Council of the Village of Loreburn, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. The Village of Loreburn will take out a loan for \$60,000.00 (sixty thousand dollars) from the Prairie Centre Credit Union.
- 2. This loan for \$60,000.00 (sixty thousand dollars) is to pay for the renovations at 534 Main St, Loreburn SK.
- 3. The Village of Loreburn will make monthly payments to Prairie Centre Credit Union for 3 years at a rate of 2.505%.
